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So I i'm Jim Brady i'm the associate vice President for for strategy, and i'm joining today by some of my amazing Sixtysburg colleagues i'm gonna turn over to sarah

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Miley first to introduce yourself. Hi everyone Mike my name is Sarah Miley.

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I'm the Denver program associate at spurt I've been working associated with this project for about 5 years, and I do a lot of community engagement and family and adult program support work so standing up some of

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the programs that we offered before we even had buildings helping with community connections and relationships, and coordinating all sorts of logistics.

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So thanks for inviting me to be here today. Yeah, we appreciate you

being here, there,

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And Catherine Penser. Everybody Katherine Ventura I'm.

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The Director of Education for Cs use for So we, the education team is responsible for all of the Pre K.

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Through 12 programs with the school groups, with the teacher, Professional development both on site and then offsite throughout the community throughout the State.

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We also work on all of the educational exhibits that you see throughout the campus and really work on that visitor experience.

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So our team are the ones who are out on the floor interpreting the programs and the experiences for our visitors. Great, thank you.

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And joshlyn Hill good afternoon everyone jocelyn hit on the associate vice chancellor here at the spur campus.

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I've been working on this project for a number of years working on program development, and then designing construction of the facilities, and we're almost there.

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We've got one building left opening on january the Sixth, and we really appreciate everyone here, here, and your interest in new new and creative programming.

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It's for we're really excited thank you We're also joined today by Wayne and Sid and I want to thank both of them for their their support.

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And making this webinar a reality. So thank you both.

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And just a little information about how we're going to proceed today.

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We invited folks to to submit questions upfront.

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We received a total 14 different questions and we're gonna start today by going occasionally 13 different questions, and we're we're going to go through that list first.

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Meanwhile we would like for you to use the Q. A.

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Widget at the bottom of the screen to submit any other questions.

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And so once we work through these the pre submitted questions we'll take

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And to kick us up i'm i'm gonna read the question, and then invite for my colleagues to way in where that i'm really tied to their expertise the the first question that we have

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today. Is there a master plan for spur that may be shared, Joslin, Would you answer that question?

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You bet. Thanks, Jim. So there is a master plan for the full National Western Center campus, which this per campus is. A part of.

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It is available at the National Western Center website, and we can certainly send that website link around.

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But if you just Google National Western Center, you can find and the master plan, you can find the link to download that document.

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It was developed back in 2,014. So some aspects of that master plan have changed pretty significantly in terms of a layout of the full National Western Center campus.

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We can also get you the zoomed in map of the spur campus, which is our 3 buildings that are part of that larger national Western Center, and we can also get you layouts floor plans of the simplified floor plans

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of the buildings, so that you can see what each of the spur facilities contains.

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Just reach out to either Gem or myself, and we can get those plans sent to you.

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So the project portfolio that is housed within those 3 facilities.

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There were some core projects that were used to help us design, some of the specialized spaces within the 3 facilities. and then there's a menu of very flexible space types from laboratories to classrooms to conference.

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Rooms and a convening spaces that all were part of that early program development.

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But that project portfolio continues to grow and evolve.

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So for those of you who may have attended this for expo.

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A few weeks ago Jim presented an emerging model educational model for spur.

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That is designed to tell a really cohesive story about how we at Spur are the Csu systems response to the evolving needs of our society and our continued commitment to enhanced educational access So we know that

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this pro, this project and program portfolio needs to continue to evolve, to be responsive to the changing needs around us, and what it is that we, as a system, can offer.

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So the expo Powerpoint and an audio recording are available.

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If you go to this spur website, which is Csu spur org backslash proposals, and you can see that really nice framework that Jim outlined during the expo. Great.

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Thank you, and we will drop these links in the chat as well.

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If I can figure out how to do this I'll take the National Western Center one for you.

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Jim I'll put that in that's excellent thanks appreciate that Johnson.

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So the next question that we have I I reviewed the existing programs on the website would be either the 37 correct Css.

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For project. will those projects be ongoing i'll i'll think they cracked at this so those current projects that are already up and running here at Csu per supported by seed funding from the csu

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system that's available for a period of up to 5 years with the expectation

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That the the program will grow additional resources over that period of time, and that the system contribution will decline so very similar to what we see in the call for proposals for fy 24 having said that everyone of

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those projects is really managed by a different project team. so every team may have sort of a different way of thinking about the the life cycle of that particular project.

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We will be evaluating those projects on a rotating basis to make sure that the that they are economically viable and continue to meet the needs of the the Csu spurred mission.

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But we have no preconceived idea that any given project will continue in perpetuity, or will fun set on any particular schedule.

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We do know, though, that there are certain projects that are launched here for that occupy a really custom built spaces for for their efforts here at Ts's.

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First, so that might include, for example, the temple grand and center, which which has you know, a series of facilities that are really tailored to those specific needs. it's very likely that that those those projects will be long term

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anchor here on site

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And the next question we have what what is the timeline for proposals?

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So I encourage you all to Take a close look at the call for performance, so we can start.

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There are a lot of details in that 6 page document. about the proposal process itself, including that timeline so that the timeline's actually on on page 6 the very last page of the of the call for

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proposals a few things I do want to point out that there is a need to submit a on October 20 eighth a letter of intent.

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So this is a mandatory part of the process it doesn't have to be long, but you need to make us aware that you are intending to submit a proposal so that letter intent to do on October

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28 right proposals themselves are not due until January thirteenth.

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Okay, I also want to point out that we have a specified cover sheet for proposals that require input from your department header chair.

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And you're dean so make sure that you're talking with the ahead of time, and that they're aware of your intense to submit this proposal.

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We're also asking that you work with your business officer in your unit to prepare the budget, so that all of that should should be an integral part of your your process, and creating this this proposal.

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But please do make sure that you are allocating sufficient time for the and I at a related note when is funding available.

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This is for proposals for fy 24, and funding will start as of July first 20 twenty-free.

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We don't necessarily expect your project to start that day but funding

is available.

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Starting that day, and as I mentioned already. funding it'll be available for up to 5 years with that declining contribution from the Cs system.

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Alright. So the next question, actually there are 2 similar questions i'm going to read them both.

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I'm going to invite jeff linda to wait in here.

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First question. Can a portion of funding be used to support people outside of the Csu system, such as a professor from another academic institution or a partner?

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Nonprofit organization. a very similar question. Can we have another university as a subcontractor?

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Joslyn, you in

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Thanks, Jim. So the answer to that question is, yes. we are interested in Colorado activities, and each project must be led by.

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Icsu staff or faculty member acting within the scope of your assigned position description, and you, job duties outside collaborations are encouraged.

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We love the idea of the expansive of expansive thinking on that and budget resources can be used to support non csu employees where their contribution to your project is essential to achieving what it is that you have

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set out to do to your project objectives so, and we may ask you for some specific documentation, and may ask some.

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Follow up questions around having those external partners or other partners from academic institutions on your team as part of the proposal process.

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So the other piece on the is specifically on other universities. i'll just double down and say again, Yes, it is allowable, but we do.

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We may have some follow up questions, and we want to be sure that that each of these projects follows typical Csu policies.

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Great, thank you. No question i'm gonna invite Sarah, to weigh in on to what extent do projects have to be specific to the Colorado community itself and in the submitter.

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Elaborate if we have a project that is focused on Colorado.

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But may inadvertently benefit or branch out to nearby intermountain regions such as Utah or Wyoming, or even nationwide.

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As that will that work in? And the particular context of the offers thinking of proposing a sort of citizen science database.

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Sarah. We love inadvertent benefits. Csu spur was designed to be a resource for the State of Colorado.

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But ideally the impacts will be felt across the globe.

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So projects that include and focus on the State of Colorado are of course, welcome.

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And we encourage those that also have benefits that extend beyond the boundary of our State.

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So the answer is, Yes.

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Yeah, and I think we already have several examples. of projects that do have bigger bigger impacts, and that that really the very welcome component

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The next one i'll i'll actually take this one I think it's a a quick question would this grant pay for travel housing and food for

participants.

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Yes, those are all allowable expenses for any project that is a per base project pretty with we're subject to all gsu rules when it comes to budget.

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So if if they're allowable expenses and they follow csu rules.

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Yes, they'd be covered the only thing i'd like to highlight as as something that we've routinely.

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Not funded would be computers for personal use computers that are required to deliver educational content, or our integral to a research project.

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So, for example, running a specific piece of research equipment it's for those those are likely to be allowable, but we wouldn't fund a laptop that you might use for multiple different. So So otherwise you're

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you're you're pretty good to go there and and Catherine.

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We actually have 2 questions that relate to k 12 education and like way in on these i'm.

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Either actually quite closely related. first of all, does spur have microscope that the public can look at

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And then second of all we'll see if he's for fun Microscopes for educational checkouts.

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Thanks, Jim. So regarding this question, I can talk about just educational equipment overall expert, so we do have for those of you who aren't aware we do have a team of educators that is based at

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spur. they're about 4 of us Now but we'll be hiring, so keep an eye out, and please help us post to your networks and get get those positions out into the world.

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But we do have equipment because we have been running programs both on site and then offsite as well.

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We do have microscopes specifically. we only have about 10 of them right now that are mobile.

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And then we are planning a wet teaching lab on the first floor of the hydro building, which will have microscopes as well.

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But there's dedicated to that call from space. I have groups that use the equipment when they're here depending on what their program.

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What I would recommend is that if you have specific equipment that you know is going to be utilized pretty regularly or frequently.

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With your program, and we might have competing use for the other education equipment that we currently have it's probably a good idea to put in some equipment into your proposal.

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The other thing you know we we can absolutely talk about this if you want to contact me directly. We can talk more about about this, because we want to be sure that we're thinking about storage about.

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Security. So there's you know various things that go into the logistics of getting equipment and resource, but happy to talk more.

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And yes, you can purchase it, and that, Rachel, you can write in specific equipment for your proposal.

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Yes, yes, and and I think this is a good moment to remind everybody that we do encourage you to reach out to us.

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I th this particular team we we assembled because of the unique skills that that each of us has, and the role that we play up for but reach out with questions consult on individual Project basis.

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We're happy to provide that as an integral part

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We also have a question I I think i'll take a crack at this.

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It's offering courses on the first campus so the fees differ from those of other courses that are offered on the main campus.

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I interpret this question to be related to Cfc.

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Courses that would offer a fee. Sorry that would offer credit.

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And we are welcoming if you courses here on site.

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Of course, those that that include a four-free fourth season before credit component

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All of these courses are actually being run through Csu online, even if they're they're in person at they they run through Csu or sorry Csu online.

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So the the policies and normal tuition rates I think I've interpreted that question right.

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But if you're out there, and and need more follow up, please let us know

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And then they have a question about rental fees and classroom spaces.

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If you offer courses on this for campus, is there a rental fee for classroom?

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Jesslyn, would you take that question, please?

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Sure. Thanks, Jim. So the answer to that question is, that fees are being waived during this startup period.

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So Csu classes that are offered at spur as part of an approved Csu for project, are not subject to space.

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Usage fees at this time. Fees, however, might be associated with the use of really specialized spaces like our theater. or if you wanted to do something specific within the greenhouse that required changes or additional staffing fees might also

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be associated with events that require increased spur staff time or for activities that you might wanna host that are revenue generating in nature, and they're specific to that.

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So if you have questions about this Csu spurs events, Director Jeremy Davis is great at providing input and advice on a case by case basis, what counts as an event, and what might be something that is that is not subject

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to any fees, because I considered an event

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The The last question that was committed ahead of time the quick and easy one.

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So i'll take that one I take the easy ones to see Will, for proposals need to be routed through the office of sponsored projects.

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The answer to that is no we're not routing these through Osp

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The the mission directions are in the the call for proposals.

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But really entail Sunday that's the beneath needs by email

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So these should be pdf pdf attachment

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And then I wanna take a moment just to remind everyone that we have the Q A.

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Widget at the bottom of your screen, so please use that to submit questions.

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So we've got several that have come in some of these are our point of clarification.

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I appreciate people following up on this. First, our decisions made based on the letters of intent submitted before puzzles or 2.

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So those those are the letters that are to be submitted by October 20 eighth.

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The answer that's no emphatically so we are asking for these letters of intent.

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One, so that our spur tactical team the liaison that come from your various unit and represent the breath of the university.

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Can number one develop a efficient review strategy so that we'll.

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We'll know how many proposals are coming. in and sort of the general topic number 2 behind the themes will be reviewing those letters of intent to look for similarity.

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So if there are 3 different proposals coming out of different colleges, for example, that relates thematically.

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It may be advantageous for those groups to work together, so we we may be reaching out on a case by case basis to to sort of connect the dots there, but we will not be formally reviewing letters of intent and while we

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will formally acknowledge receipt of that letter of intent.

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You should understand immediately that you are welcome to submit a proposal in January.

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Another question we have during the webinar you stated that the initiative that that this project needs to be led by a current Csu employee, if funded, if the project's funded did that person need to

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continuously lead or manage the project, or can part of the funding be to hire someone would be who would directly handle the oversight of it.

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And or could that responsibility to go to a graduate student?

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Yes, yes. So our our comment really was meant to indicate that while outside partners are welcome as team members projects themselves must initiate from Csu staff or faculty.

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You are certainly welcome to hire graduate students, or or other individuals that would oversee the project.

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If that's the fundamental piece of that let's see here, another question: Would you please clarify a little more if we I would like to teach a course that spur?

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Does it have to be taught through Csu online at the same time?

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So do we need to develop the material for Csu online as well.

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This. this is the point of confusion. And the online is really the formal mechanism within the Csu system.

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The Csu environment to deliver courses that are not on the main campus, so are not being taught in person in Fort Collins.

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So really, for in-person classes that are happening at spur, students have to register through online.

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But the course is taught only in person for so you're not You're not forced to teach this online or create additional content.

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It really is more of the student registration component And in all the rules that that are connected with on the back end with budget sharing really aligned with with arrangements made through you online, does anyone

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wanna elaborate on that, or clarify anything I just said

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Here.

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So there's another question here can we charge fringe also.

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How will you award the funding, for example, one lump sum?

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Jocelyn, would you like to come in on that, please?

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Yeah, sure The fringe question Yes, fringe can be included should be included, for when you're hiring folks. so that, is an expectation that fringe would be included in your budget, and the

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second question. Second part of that question i've lost let me pull How will we award funding So it does not arrive as one love sum the way that we do funding is we actually reimburse

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for actual expense. So, on a quarterly basis, we expect that your business officer would essentially invoice the system, office and oversimplifying this, but would essentially invoice the system office.

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And we would reimburse for actual expenses incurred. great.

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Thank you. And another question of the application emphasizes sustainability of the project beyond the the initial 5 year commitment from the system in terms of financial sustainability.

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What are you looking for is based funding from Csu on the table?

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I am interpreting this question to differentiate Csu from Csu system.

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So the funding that is available through this call for proposals is funding specifically from the Csu system.

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With the idea that that that component will both decline over 5 years, and then terminate after 5 years, or whatever.

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The the length of request is no more than 5 years.

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So we are really encouraging you to be creative in the way you utilize spur as an asset to grow resources.

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Some projects are pursuing typically multiple streams actually, but with some projects are pursuing things like enhancing grant competitiveness.

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Growing student tuition dollars. leveraging philanthropic relationships or industry relationships that are facilitated by our unique Denver location.

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So there are multiple ways in which an individual project might grow.

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That component in terms of csu funding which I again i'm differentiating from csu system.

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That certainly can be part of that mix. and we envision that certain projects may, for example, grow a student pipeline into a particular program.

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So there may not be a dollar component associated with that particular company here at Spur, but the college or the unit may actually re benefit through enhancing student enrollment in programs up in Fort Collins under those

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circumstances that discussion to have with your your department chair or head, or your dean because if it aligns with the the importance and and needs of that unit, there may be funding available.

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So so funny from any sources other than the system is is really what we're looking for over that might be period.

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Hi, Joshua, do you want to elaborate on that at all? Nope.

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I think I think you had it. Thank you. See here, can we give a few

examples of current projects or projects that are already approved and upcoming?

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Yes, we can. I do want to point out that this is actually available on the the Csc. for website.

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They don't have in front of me so let me just just call this I'm gonna tell you exactly where that is.

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It's under the get involved. tab so there's a list at the very bottom to see if you Oh, Cfc. program tips for so there are 37 different projects.

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That are really coming from the breadth of of our our university.

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One example is a a masters in Agra, business and food innovation, and coming out of the College of Agriculture.

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Sciences So that got launched here on site. this past fall.

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The the the College of Natural Sciences is piloting them based courses in hybrid format.

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So biology and chemistry courses will be taught online.

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For the lecture component, and then the the lab pieces will be taught as as weekend intensive. here at spur college of engineering is is working in the K 12 space creating boot camps for incoming

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freshmen to help them brush up their math skills.

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College of Liberal Arts, as a program called kids do it all, which is really a musical summer theater experience where where kids design and execute every aspect of that.

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So those those are the few and i'm or the at at risk of, you know, playing favorites here. But just to give you kind of the broad flavor of what's out there and again you can you can

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access. this app for webinar

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If we will not have an opportunity to visit this for campus.

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Are you available to insult us on what physical spaces?

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Would be ideal for our program programming you that's an ematic Yes,
and depending on the nature of your program.

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You know we might want to tailor who's part of that conversation.

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So I would say, reach out to any one of us on a case by case basis,
and we can figure out what that is.

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We. We have information available on lists. We can certainly connect
you with our events.

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Director Katherine and her team are are really the people consult on
that like the K.

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12 educational P. 12 educational space, and the visitor experience

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So. so i'd say, just reach out and we can help figure out who would
best person is to talk to

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And if funded, what is the typical expectation for updates, report,
progress meetings, etc.? really really insightful question?

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Joshlyn gave me a thumbs up I'm gonna invite her to lay in on this
one.

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Okay, okay. It is a great question. I was thumbs up in your response.

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It's nice. So the this is still a bit of a work in progress, and i'll
ask Jim to weigh into if I miss anything here.

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But our expectation is that, as I mentioned, quarterly budget reports will come to us for us to reimburse and we're working on a basic template for progress toward deliverables on a quarterly basis that

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would be very simple, not onerous, but just intended to give us a snapshot of where you are in the project, and catch any challenges that you might be having soon so that we can work with you to identify and

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address anything that might be coming up in the early months of your project so quarterly.

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We're looking for the for that information and then we would expect an annual report.

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That goes into a bit more detail around progress toward what you've outlined as your own goals as well as how it's how it's going with your work within the sort of graders for community and hitting on

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some of the targets that spur has that are part of the evaluation criteria for your project, so none of that is a surprise.

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Do I have that right, Jim? yeah, yes. The 1 one thing I might like to add is that for multi year projects.

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We will be, of course, asking for the annual report, and funding in future years really is dependent on on making continuous and adequate progress towards your your project.

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Goals t same as any other project. that might be free externally.

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What in? And And I I think to it a good time to mention that to be a spur means you're really part of a community that is

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Both acts and cultural institution. We We do invite people to to wander our buildings.

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We're open 9 to 5 Monday through Friday and the second Saturday of the month.

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With special programming offered on those second Saturdays.

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So it it's quite important that when you're engaging Here you are of the mindset that you're You're here to educate a broader public and be part of this this broad community.

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So you may be asked occasionally to participate in

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You know some of those go, those extra activities that that go beyond what a typical academic program might entail, such as, you know, being part of a second Saturday periodically are contributing to some of our

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communications efforts in that space. 6, Sarah or Catherine, do you either?

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Do you want to elaborate on I think I just said I wish just gonna yeah her from the fact that it's a a team effort in terms of maintaining good relationships with our community partners.

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If there's a community or educational component of your program.

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So we're here to support you and there's a lot of optional ways that you can plug in and get updates from our end, and we can share updates with you.

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We also are open to scheduling meetings.

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So we can connect on progress. if that helps your program or you think it would be helpful for others to know at spur.

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So there's a lot of choose your own adventure ways that we can work together.

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But the The general public kind of sees us all as one. so we like to act as the team in this regard.

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Do you have anything to add? I think you you and then covered it really well and just would reiterate that it.

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It is definitely a team effort. and I think another good example.

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When we were talking about programs, examples of programs that had received funding.

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Some of them are, are really well established community or educational programs.

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Already in the Fort Collins area or around colorado and they're using Denver and Spur to grow that awareness to grow the audience that we're able to provide these experiences for so it's it's just

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a really great opportunity. if you have something that's already successful, that you think spur would be a great way to be a new platform.

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For that program. it's it's a great opportunity. And then also thinking about you know, if you're at capacity with not having additional staff.

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You could write step into that proposal like jimmy Justin.

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We're saying, and you can also talk with with education with me and my team to see is this something that we could train the education team on to deliver your program in Denver or in our outreach initiative so like

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Sarah said it's it's just a really great opportunity to go and and grow these programs that

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Great. thank you. So let's see I think that is the last question that we I received.

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Now wait just a few more seconds, in case somebody wants to add one

more question

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Hey? I think, while we're waiting I I do wanna reiterate again that you know we're here to help you. that That really is the ethos here. so so don't be shy about reaching out yeah

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we could get a question in great, so one more came in.

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If the regular use of space is requested in a proposal, and that proposals awarded, does that also expire in 5 years?

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What option might exist for extending the use of that space, if it is an integral, if if it is integral for the continued success of the program, even if other funding is in place to cover from expenses i'll

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i'll invite Jos one to week and on that please Sure the use of space does not expire after 5 years.

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We hope that there are some projects that are very successful in finding funding and support, and continue to run at Spur for a very long time.

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So we would work the same way that we work to schedule spaces for any program, and similar to what you probably experience in Fort Collins in terms of space planning and scheduling.

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We would work to accommodate a a long term program absolutely.

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That would be a a big marker of success. actually

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Okay, Another question just came in. I I may have missed this, but is there a ceiling limit we could propose?

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I i'm assuming this this I don't know how to interpret that question is is is that referring to the physical space as it's for

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Physical space through a space limit we can propose.

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So if if you have a request that requires space long term commitment of space to your project, and it's not a space that we can sort of simultaneously use for other activities.

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I think we better have a conversation about that to make sure that we can accommodate whatever your needs are.

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Much of the space that we have here really operates on a flex use capacity.

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So, for example, classrooms might be utilized by one program in the morning.

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Another program in the afternoon community group. in the evening.

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So Generally those flex use if it's sort of a typical base that you'd find on a university campus, and you're you're going to use it for a limited period.

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Of time. We probably can accommodate that anything that's going to be more elaborate.

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I think we should probably talk, and please reach out

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Anything else from the

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Okay, I'm gonna drop my email address in the chat i'm certainly invite my to do the same if they're interested.

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Feel free to reach out with any additional questions that arise.

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I can answer them or we'll share them with with the team here, so we can get them answered see Johnson just added sarah's there, so feel free to reach out to us again, We're representing

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a small and mighty team of folks here at first so we'll we'll connect with the right person, if we're not that individual.

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Another question came in. If you intend to hire student internal in the summer of 2,023 to work on the proposed project, is there an opportunity to have them paid and start?

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At the beginning of the summer June first so the the question really relates to the fact that the fiscal year starts July first.

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So that doesn't necessarily align with when student interns may be looking for application.

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Joshly, do you want to wait on that sure So i'm trying to remember the approval date. Jim in the proposal schedule is March.

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Well, the the it it's a soft target and I think it's actually in June.

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And and the the reason we're we have a lot to work through behind the teams.

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Our technical team will be evaluating. Certainly we need Csu leadership as well as Csu system leadership to weigh in.

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And then our board of governors i'll is responsible for allocating funds for projects.

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So it's a it's a rather complicated process Having said that we have some flexibility, some limited flexibility, to make those decisions where where time is really of the essence.

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And I would suggest that we work together. i'll set that conversation earlier rather than than later in that process.

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Oh, sorry, no, please, Justin, go ahead. I was just gonna I. I asked the question in part, because I think there are some steps in the approval process that we will likely be through earlier rather than later, and we likely can figure out a way

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for us to float funding. if your project has gotten through much of

the approval process. so that you could start a student in June instead of July.

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In fact, thank you for that question, because we can work to on our end to put some structures in place, to allow for circumstances like that for approved projects or projects that we anticipate being approved by the board of governors understanding

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that the board's approval in the june meeting is really the the the final step in that process.

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So we certainly will. would would love to have a conversation with you about what you what you're thinking about.

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There and see if there's a way that we can accommodate that request.

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Yeah, I I aim to have our our tactical team, which will be the first body to really dealt into these projects.

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I I hope to be able to work with them, to to have

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Yeah, by probably mid march to have our our slate of project that we're gonna recommend for funding.

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So so we we'll we'll we'll get in that final.

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But we'll be able to to certainly comment on the the the opportunity, the the challenge for any particular project.

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We will know if you're still in the mix or not at that point.

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So let's let's have those conversations that are involved evolved.

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I'm, not seeing any additional questions let's see and we are getting a reminder, though, to let you know that the recording that we're we're making today.

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We'll be available on that for landing that for proposal funding Page.

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So let me drop that in the chat again. so it'll probably take about a week for us to get that up there, but we'll have focus reporting and the Faq.

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That's associated with these questions and I think that's it for today.
